

Square in Square

The Comfort Quilt committee needs more juvenile themed comfort quilts. This square really does the trick and is so easy that you could make a half dozen in an afternoon. Quilters cache calls this a process rather than an actual pattern. These directions are for a 10 and a half inch square, but if you want to make some for yourself here is the formula:

Cut the center square the size you want your block PLUS ½ inch for seam allowances...and you cut the corner squares at HALF the finished block size, PLUS ½ inch for seam allowances.

For this month's Square in a Square you will need a **10 ½ inch square** of juvenile fabric and **four 5 ½ inch squares** of white or white on white fabric.



Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the back side of each of the white squares.



Position them right sides together in two opposite corners of the larger square.



Sew on the diagonal just inside your drawn line.



Trim the seam to ¼ inch. Do the same thing with the other two white squares.

Press the white squares to the outside and voila, your Square in Square block for September.
