## Hole in the Barn Door for August, 2019

The comfort quilt committee is in need of more juvenile blocks so this one should work really well. If you are making a comfort quilt, please make it at least $36^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime}$. Anything smaller is really too small to use except for infants.
This square is a relative of Churn Dash so you will sew the first row together, then the second and finally the third before joining all three rows Please be very accurate with your $1 / 4$ inch seams. Mine are always a bit smaller than $1 / 4$ inch which makes this a true $121 / 2$ inch square.

CUT
1-61/2-inch square of focus fabric
2 - 4-inch squares of white or white on white and a contrasting print. 1-1 $1 / 2$ inch $X 26$-inch strip of the contrast 1-2 $1 / 2$ inch $X 26$-inch strip of white or white on


## white



Place one print 4-inch square on top of one white square, right sides together. Mark a diagonal from corner to corner. Then sew a scant $1 / 4$ inch on either side of the diagonal line. Cut the
 squares apart to yield four half square triangles. Trim them to $3 \frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Then sew the contrasting $1-1 / 2$ "x 26 " strip right sides together to the top edge of the white $2-1 / 2$ "
 $\times 26^{\prime \prime}$ strip, using a scant $1 / 4$ " seam. Press seam to darker side. Mark this and cut at $6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ intervals.

Now piece the block as shown at right. Make three rows, using the focus fabric $6 \frac{1}{2}$ "square as the block's center. Pressing seams in alternate directions by row. Sew the rows together and you've done it!
