## The Kitchen Woodbox for November

The comfort quilt committee is in need of more juvenile blocks so this one should work really well. This makes a nine and $1 / 2$-inch block. (nine inch finished)

Choose two bright colors and a white or white on white fabric.
For this example; the large print is color 1, blue solid is color $\mathbf{2}$ and the white center square and half triangle is 3 .
Cut a $2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from both colors 1 and 2 at least 15 inches long. Cut four $23 / 8$-inch squares from color 1.

Cut four 2" squares from color 2.
Cut two $37 / 8$-inch squares and one $31 / 2$ square from 3 (white).


Cut the two white $37 / 8$ inch squares the four color 1 squares in half on the diagonal.
Sew the color 1 and 2 strips together with a $1 / 4$ inch seam. Then cut the strip into four $31 / 2$ inch square units.


To make the clock's corner units, sew a Color 1 half square triangle to the left and top edges of a color 2-2 inch square, pressing seams toward the triangles.


Add a Color 3 (white) half square triangle to the pieced triangle, pressing seams to one side. Make four units like this. Trim these squares to $31 / 2$ inches.

Lay out all units as shown. Sew three horizontal rows, alternating pressing directions by row. Join the rows and you have a finished $91 / 2$ inch square.
