

## Sawtooth Block

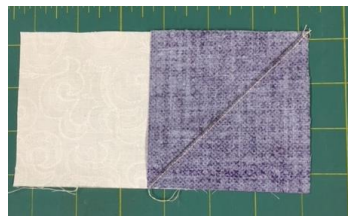
The comfort committee would like you to make this Sawtooth block with bright colors and WHITE or WHITE ON WHITE. This is a great block to use a fun focus fabric for the 6 ½ inch square in the center. Your finished block will measure 12 ½ inches.

Cut your focus fabric into 1 (one) 6 ½ inch square and set aside.

Cut the bright accompanying fabric into 8 (eight) 3 ½ inch squares. You will use these squares for the “wings” of your flying geese.

Cut the white fabric into 4 (four) 3 ½ “X 6 ½ “rectangles.

To make the flying geese units, place a bright 3 ½ inch square, right sides together atop a white rectangle with the outer edges aligned. On the back of the top square lightly mark the diagonal. Sew on this diagonal marking. (I have found that you need to sew just a needles width inside the marking). Cut off the excess seam allowance. Press the remainder towards the corner. Repeat this with another bright 3 ½ “square on the other end of the rectangle. Make four of these.



Lay out the units according to the picture. Sew three horizontal rows, pressing the top and bottom row seams to the center, and the middle row seam to the outside. Sew the rows together and you are all done with your Sawtooth block.
