

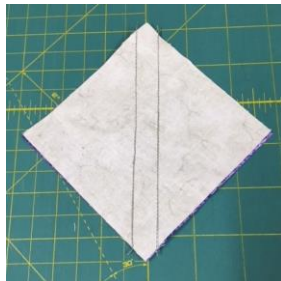
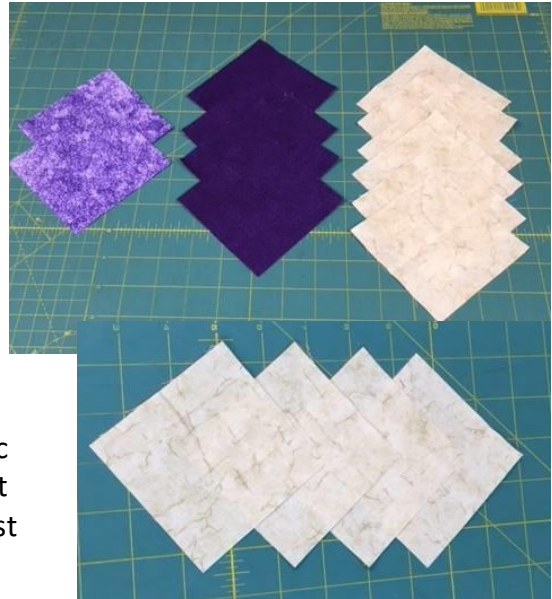
Saw Tooth Star

The comfort quilt committee is nearly out of comfort quilts after the last disbursement, so this block can be made in brights, juvenile prints or whatever you have lying around in your sewing studio. Just remember that the light color this month is off white, cream, or something other than WHITE.

This square is another stash buster and continues my love affair with half square triangles. You will be creating 8 HST of one hue and 4 of another.

Cut six 4-inch squares from cream fabric
Cut four 4-inch squares from the featured print.

Cut two 4-inch squares from a contrast
Cut four 3 ½ inch squares from cream fabric



Stack a 4" cream colored fabric square with a 4" featured print square and the 4" dark contrast square.

Lightly draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew ¼ inch above and below this line. Cut apart at the drawn line. Press seams open. You will have 12 half square triangles. Trim them to 3 ½ inches.

Place the 3 ½ inch squares of off white in the four corners and arrange the other half square triangles as shown at right.
