Many thanks to Mary Ann and all of you for your support and attention the last 18 months as your VP. You are a fabulous bunch of ladies and I've enjoyed my time as VP. I can't wait to see what Joan has coming up for us! Here are instructions for the scrap block I showed at the last meeting. Originally the design is from a free tutorial by 3 Dudes Quilting. I adapted it to use 2.5" strips. The free tutorial is on Missouri Star under tutorials. You have to scroll a long way to find it, so keep looking,

Pam

Cut 4 strips 2.5" x 10"

Sew 4 strips together to make a 8.5 x 10" strip set.

Trim to 8.5 square blocks.

Sew strips into light and dark blocks.

Stack the blocks right sides together as shown.

Stitch around the outside of the block , 1/4" seam.

Cut block twice diagonally

You will get 4 - 5.5" blocks from each pair of strip blocks.

Trim to 5.5" . Sew 4 blocks together to make 10.5" blocks.

Use a fabric square for light blocks for even quicker piecing.

We received so many compliments about the 2023 quilt show, but we're always looking to make it better. Some of the changes for next year include:

- A PUBLICITY OFFICER!!! Who will be proactive in advertising the show (locally and digitally) and the guild's involvement in the community throughout the year.
- Equipment: we have purchased more mallets and several sets of kneepads to make set up and take down easier on our bones! Additionally, we'd like to discuss buying a fancy new projector + screen + speaker system that would be used for demos at the show (and would be available to be used at meetings as well).
- ROTC: better communication to ensure sufficient help (and so we can tap into other volunteer groups if necessary). Delay the food-reward to ensure longer participation.
- Food: we actually had TOO MANY cookies (we love you!). Grab-and-go meals for volunteers
 Friday night were a hit, as was the attention to special dietary needs. We may need to
 reconsider the food budget, though.
- Demos: should include guild members, too! Pam Brooks & Barb Boland's scraps program from
 our last meeting would be awesome! We also have graphic designers in our midst who could put
 a color theory class together. Maybe paper piecing, or a binding ... not just vendors & products.
- Vendors: need better follow-up and should also be provided lanyard name badges for easy identification.
- Signage: as always, the back gym is overlooked, and we should make a large freestanding arrow (or find our old one?). Some have suggested we display quilts outside (comfort quilts or unfinished tops or painted barn squares?)
- 2024 challenge: "Carla Pfaff memorial challenge" using some of her fabric.
- 2024 featured quilter: BARBARA BOLAND
- Categories: one intriguing suggestion on reorganizing our categories is to have entries by size
 only and awards in each size for best embroidery, best piecing, best quilting, and overall. If you
